Vaccinations

All people entering or working in a remote community must have had their first dose by 12th November and their second does 24th bv December.

Are you worried about getting this vaccine?

Speak to clinic staff, your elders and community workers to get your needle today. Its never too late to get a vaccine.



Mask Wearing

From 15th November, All workers or residents entering a remote community from Darwin, Katherine, Alice Springs or outside the Territory will be required to wear a mask at all times for seven days when in public

Covid-19 testing

From 19th November all people travelling to remote communities will need to receive a negative rapid antigen Covid-19 test 72 hours prior to entry. Please Contact NT COVID-19 Hotline, 1800 490 484
